## RAISING THE ROOF

In my last newsletter article I undertook to provide readers with an update on the financial aspects of the Church Extension project. Thanks to the generosity of our many supporters, both inside and outside the parish, and the assistance of equally generous grant-aid providers, we are now within sight of our final target, based on what we know today. And, of course, we can now see the new room taking shape.

The total project cost including furnishing is now estimated at approximately £165,000. We have currently either spent, have to hand, or promised to us, approximately £161,200 – in other words, £3,800 still to raise. We are considering options that might affect the final cost. The biggest risk area is heating, where we are working with the architect and the builder to find a really good long-term solution. The other area is furnishing, where we still have to source the needed items within the set budget.

In 2004 and 2005 the big financial milestones included:

**Grants:** from the Maud Yeardye Bequest, the Welsh Assembly Government, the Garfield Weston Foundation and St Asaph Diocese, the Rank Organisation and our insurance company: £107,200 in total

**Gift Day:** 10,000+ and still coming in

**Wider Public Appeal:** £6,000+

**Fundraising:** £1,000+

**Gift Aid Tax Refund:** £3,000+

So, in summary

- On the one hand, a fantastic achievement in a small parish, and our thanks must go out to all who have been so generous with their support in terms of time and talent as well as materials and cash.
- On the other hand, there is still a bit more to be done. We have the Promises Auction and the Grand Draw early in May, then the Pageant, and we hope that these will be supported as enthusiastically as our other events. **Please** remember, too, that the books are still open for the public appeal if you wish to contribute, or contribute further.

### *A BYGONE AGE*

One of our readers has come across some parish magazines dating from the end of the 19<sup>th</sup> century and representing the Parish Church and Holy Trinity in Oswestry, Whittington, Moreton, Frankton, Trefonen, Selattyn, Rhydycroesau, Llansilin and Llanyblodwel. Here is a delightful extract from the March 1896 edition.

#### *“The Band of Hope, Llansilin*

*On Friday evening, 7th February, the faithful members of the Band of Hope were entertained to a splendid tea and coffee supper, kindly provided by the Committee - Mr and Mrs Whitfield, Moeliwrch; Mr R R Lewis and Miss Lewis, Glan-yr-Afon; Miss Richards, Miss Evans, Tyn-y-coed; Miss Jones, Shop; and Miss Petters. Justice having been done to the eatables, the younger and older members formed themselves into two companies, and spent three most enjoyable hours in innocent games and playing.”*

Those were the days! We hope to have more Llansilin extracts in future editions.

## MOTHERING SUNDAY

Members of Llansilin and Llangedwyn congregations were greeted by ringing of the church bells at the annual Mothering Sunday service. The service was taken by the Rev C F Carter, who read a lesson, as did Glenice Jones. Organist was Morfudd Williams and the collection was taken by Huw Lewis of Craiglwyn and William Jones from Llangedwyn. Posies were given to the children by the vicar and Jeanne Kulig distributed them to members of the congregation. During the service Kai Luke, son of Jeanette and Tom and grandson of Margaret and Arthur Jones, was baptised. Thank you to members of the Mothers Union for providing the flowers and foliage and to Christine Williams for making them into attractive posies.

## LLANSILIN COMMUNITY COUNCIL

The March meeting was presided over by Cllr Mrs M Evans, supported by the clerk, Mr H Hughes.

Following a request for an additional street light near the Baptist Chapel, the lighting officer had visited the site and said the application could not be supported. The pothole near the crossroads had been attended to and a new safety mirror was being provided at the top of the village. A "Cadwgan Road" sign was to be placed at the junction near the church gate. Applications for new dwellings at Tyn Llyn, Moelfre; Pwllymeirch Bach, Llansilin and Tynywaen, Penybont, were supported, as was the conversion of barn to dwelling at Pentre, Llansilin.

Members discussed at length the future administration of the public conveniences in Llansilin, following the decision by Powys County Council to cease to maintain this facility. The clerk had received an assurance from the council's insurers that, in the event of the community council assuming responsibility, the existing public liability policy would also cover these premises. Members were agreed that the closure of these conveniences would be a severe loss to the village and that an attempt be made to retain them, if only during the summer months. The clerk was asked to exhibit notices in the village inviting applications for the post of part-time cleaner.

The Council's application for a concurrent function grant of £100 had been successful.

Correspondence: One Voice Wales, constitution and standing orders; Welsh Assembly, account and audit regulations; Powys CC, liaison meeting with town and community councils, planning meeting and bus and bus stop survey; Powys Local Health Board, report prepared in accordance with the Welsh Language Act 1993 and report on strategy for older people in Powys; Welsh Assembly, burial ground surveys.

A communication from Cymdeithas Carnhuanawc congratulated Llansilin on their mosaic in remembrance of Owain Glyndwr but regretted the absence of direction signs to this historic site and sought the Community Council's assistance in rectifying this. The clerk explained that several approaches had been made to the highway authority and to the Wales Tourist Board, both of whom had denied responsibility. It was agreed to approach CADW who had recently tidied up the area.

A donation of £100 was made to the Llansilin Church Pageant, 2005. The clerk was requested to report an unlicensed car on the public car park.

## THE VILLAGE SIGN

The sign board on the village car park, portraying Owain Glyndwr and his wife, has recently been the subject of an appreciative letter to the Community Council. Plans have been made to mount an information board on the reverse side. The prepared design work gives details in Welsh and English of Owain Glyndwr's life, together with a map and directions to Sycharth. Funds/grants/donations amounting to approximately £500, are needed to complete the project.

## EASTER SUNDAY

The church was well attended for the Easter Day communion service. The Reverend C F Carter took the service, Graham Moss read the lesson, the organist was Morfudd Williams and the collection was taken by the church wardens, Esther Milner and Mary Morris. Easter eggs were kindly given by the vicar and distributed at the conclusion of the service. A sincere **THANK YOU** to everyone who kindly helped in the "extra clean" of the church for Easter, for decorating the church and for donations towards the flowers. As usual, the church was sparkling and the flowers all shone brilliantly.

## FASHION SHOW

The fashion show given by "Just the Right Thing" of Oswestry, held on Easter Monday afternoon, was a great success. The proprietor, Karen Morris, was a very able compere and introduced the various models, who included our very own Christine Williams. A wide variety of spring clothes were modelled and much admired by everyone. Traditional afternoon tea was served. £330+ was raised towards the day-to-day running costs of the church and the raffle raised £83 for the Royal Shrewsbury Hospital's Cardiac Ward.

## OPEN STUDIOS EVENT




